<b>SUMMARY OF SEASON:</b>	<p>After a league winning season last year, the u12 girls made a strong start to the u12 season being crowned u12 Indoor County Softball Champions. This competition was a great way to get the girls fired up ahead of their outdoor cricket. We entered the girls into the Cambridgeshire u11 hardball league this year which gave us the chance to play a team of 10 rather than 8 and to line up against different opposition than in our West Essex season last year. We had a sizeable squad but a wide variety of hardball experience from new joiners to county players and the pairs format gave us the perfect opportunity to support and develop the newer players while giving the more experienced girls added responsibility within the team.</p> <p>Attendance at training this year was a little erratic due to regular clashes for this age group between training and matches and we will try to avoid that next year. As last year, the benefits of the Academy Winter Nets were felt particularly in the early matches of the season and helped us to make a strong start.</p> <p>Thanks to the boys who helped us out with great good humour- Hari, Rohan, Billy, Seth and Wulfie, Hari. Their support was much appreciated and enabled us to play (and sometimes win) some games that we would otherwise have had to concede.</p> <p>It was a challenging season but the girls played with great energy and enthusiasm and their development over the course of the season was clear to see.</p>

<b>SUMMARY OF SEASON:</b>	<p>Our U13 girls squad played in the Essex girls league this year, as well as the ECB T20 knockout cup. They were delighted to continue last year's winning form in an early season friendly against Wendens boys (Alice Lindsay Clark's bowling was instrumental in settling the score after the girls narrowly lost to her brother's team last year!) but the girls continued in their same cheerful and collaborative spirit throughout the season, even when they weren't on the winning side! Excellent attendance at both Academy winter nets and summer training meant that the girls were ready for the season ahead.</p> <p>The girls faced some tough oppositions in the Essex League and unfortunately several matches ended up being conceded, due to short squad numbers on both sides, but it was encouraging to play all-girls teams and they gained experience from playing hardball matches at this level. They pulled off a good win against a strong Wanstead side, thanks to an innings of 31 from India Casson and particularly impressive bowling figures from Isabelle Dupont Short of 2 wickets for 4 runs off 2 overs, as well some very economical bowling all round, conceding only 10 extras in the whole innings.</p> <p>The girls also won the first round of the T20 knockout cup against Hitchin by an impressive 50 runs, with Ariana Wilson scoring 28 not out and two wickets each for Ariana, Nancy Rowlandson and Mila Welch. They only narrowly lost to Bishops Stortford in the last three balls of the second round – wickets for Gemma Smethers and Mila Welch and Ariana Wilson, some more of Emily Rumsby's amazingly economical spin bowling and an innings of 33 from Ariana weren't quite enough to get them over the line.</p> <p>Two competitive friendlies against our old friends, Cambridge City, rounded off the U13 girls season – we didn't manage a win in either of these this year but they were played in a great spirit and exciting matches all the same.</p> <p>As the manager of these girls, I'm very proud of the way they go about their matches – always trying to do their best individually, as well as supporting their teammates and all done whilst making sure their enjoyment of the game and the good company of their cricketing friends is top priority. We don't see so many cartwheels whilst fielding in the outfield anymore though, so things have obviously started to get more serious! The girls should all be very proud of their achievements as well as their excellent commitment to training and matches. Special mention to Emily Rumsby and Alice Elphick for constantly economical bowling figures and to Darcy Hurrell and Mila Welch who quickly proved themselves invaluable new members of the squad; batting, bowling and fielding. The scorebook figures don't always reflect everything that makes up a team's performances though so special mention must go to India Casson for hard-work and commitment, wicket-keeping at every match (as well as to Kirsty Smethers' for a very promising start to her wicket-keeping career!) and for the good supporting batting roles played by Megan Lodwig and Isabelle Dupont Short which proved crucial to our two wins. ## Academy Awards: Notes

Players may be nominated for **representative cricket** in Essex or Cambridgeshire if they are considered ready to perform at such a level. However, playing at this level relies on commitment as well as talent. If you feel you would like to be considered or if you feel you or your parents cannot make this commitment, please speak to your manager.

**Highest batting average** min. 5 innings/**Lowest bowling average** min. 10 overs. Because young players play so few matches we don't insist on 5 'completed' innings before they qualify with an average. This is not the case in senior cricket. Please note that a more accurate picture of performance can be gained the more overs bowled or the more innings batted. A low minimum has been chosen to involve as many players as possible in the statistics. Overall batting and bowling awards are made by managers in consultation with coaches and others. There are no definitive criteria.

**Club caps** awarded to any established Academy player taking 5 wickets in one match (including 5 stumpings and/or catches by a wicket keeper), scoring a century, playing at County level or being a first choice selection for the senior SWCC teams or village teams with whom SWCC have a formal arrangement. **Club caps** will be awarded to girls for taking 3 wicket/catches, scoring 50 in a match and for County or adult selection.

**Players' Player** may be awarded on the basis of Player of the Match nominations over the course of a season or a vote amongst other squad members.

**Academy records** have been compiled since 2003. There may well be superior performances before that – just let us know.

**The Alfred Adams Batting Award.** Alfred Adams scored 279 not out by batting all day against Bishop's Stortford for SWCC on the Common on 11 July 1837. At the time it was the highest recorded individual score in the country.

**Fiona Harris** was the first woman to play competitively for SWCC in 2002.

**John Smith** first played for SWCC in 1946 and retired in 1963 at the age of 35. He is the tallest of the team in many of the clubhouse photos of the 1950s and 60s. John passed away in 2009

**Josh Bysouth** was an u13 Academy player when he died in a car accident with his Grandfather in 2012

**The Ron Muggeridge Academician of the Year** is awarded to the academy player who has made the strongest commitment to his or her own development and to the work of the Academy and Club. It may be related to the "Clubman of the Year" award for each age group.

**Steve Jones Spirit of Cricket Award** (introduced 2019) to reflect the Laws of the Game and the values of Saffron Walden Cricket Club. Named after former Vice President and MCC member, Steve Jones. The Club wants to recognise Academy members who demonstrate the Spirit of Cricket in their behaviours, as well as those who help to win games. We were therefore very pleased to announce a new award in 2019: the Steve Jones Spirit of Cricket Award. This



award recognises the Academy member, of any age, gender or ability, who is considered to have demonstrated best the behaviours of sportsmanship, respect, encouragement and responsibility.

**Rajapack Awards** Jack Petchey Awards were given for outstanding personal achievement 2006-2015. The club withdrew from the scheme in 2015 – it did not recognise youngsters under the age of 11 and the criteria for awards became unduly restrictive. It has been replaced with the **Rajapack Award Scheme**. The club will receive £100 for every century, 3 catches and 5 wickets in a single match in senior cricket from u16 upwards. We will also receive £100 for every 50 and 5fer and 3 catches in junior T20 cricket and similarly £100 for every 30, 3 wickets and 2 catches in girls and Crocus cricket. In junior T20 matches played with a “retire after 30 runs” rule, then a Rajapack award goes to players getting 30 runs in each of two matches We currently do not issue individual medals or trophies, preferring to issue certificates. This maximises involvement and keeps costs low. However, sponsors for individual trophies shown on the previous page are always welcome
